Our barn quilt tour starts and ends at the Cozad Chamber, including primarily quilts within the Cozad city limits. At the end of this list are quilts located in the country and in Gothenburg and Lexington. Feel free to follow this route, or drive around at leisure. You'll see plenty of outdoor art including Rhakenna's Wings/Wings Across the Heartland and the Cozad Creates Icons along your way. Be sure to visit the sculpture garden at the Wilson Public Library. 3	Nebraska Pinwheel	Well House Building	Highway 30 and Ave H, Cozad NE 69130	Painted by Jan Anderson and Bonnie Hansen to celebrate Nebraska's 150th birthday. In 1977, the Lincoln Quilters Guild (LQG) sponsored a contest to select a quilt block to honor the State of Nebraska. The contest was held in conjunction with Quilt Symposium '77: Fine Art, Folk Art, planned and hosted by LQG. The 85th Nebraska State Legislature passed Legislative Resolution Number One in January 1977 to designate the winning block as the Official Nebraska Block. The winning block, Nebraska Windmill, was designed by E. S. Bud" Dunklau of Lincoln, Nebraska. Carol and Bud Dunklau gave the original block pattern and rights to the pattern to LQG. The original cloth block was given to the Nebraska State Historical Society by LQG.
4	50 States Barn Quilt Display	Cozad Tourism/Located on North Side of Mead Lumber Storage Building	114 West 7th St, Cozad NE 69130	<p>The display is 6' x 50' with all 50 states represented. Block designs were used with permission from "The 50 States Patchwork Pattern Book" from Dover Publications. The designs originally appeared in Hearth and Home Magazine as part of a contest where the magazine asked readers to submit a block to represent their state. The 48 winning blocks were included in monthly issues of the magazine between 1907-1912. In 1976, Dover acquired the rights to the blocks and published patchwork patterns for the blocks, adding a block for Alaska and Hawaii. This traditional railroad crossing block is a nod to the historic depot. The Cozad depot now houses the Cozad Charitable Fund, Wilson Human Service Center. Built in 1925, it was designed by Gilbert Stanley Underwood, who also designed the ornate Union Station in Omaha, the San Francisco Mint, other train depots and national park lodges, in the Old Faithful Lodge in Yellowstone. The railroad stopped using it and donated the building. It was later moved away from the tracks and turned 180 degrees. The ticket window and train schedule board are still in place inside. 6	Wabi Sabi and Others	The Old Cozad Mill	219 E 6th, Cozad NE 69130	Machelle Smith has renovated the historic Old Mill building, saving this wonderful landmark for future generations. Enjoy a variety of barn quilts, Wings, and other Outdoor Art on several sides of The Old Mill.

This barn quilt celebrates the Elk's traditional colors of Purple and White. a combination deriving its origin from the history of the clergy, nobility and the people. Since its founding on February 16, 1868, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE) has been recognized by the noble creature that is the symbol of the Order. The Crown of Thorns block is also highlighted in a small, individual barn quilt located on the East side of the building, near the front entrance to the church.
